Reading

- Everyday at home and at school
- Individual and group reading in school
- Increasing emphasis on comprehension
- Children choose their own books

Writing

- Cursive handwriting
- Every letter starts on the line
- Join up
- Friday morning handwriting focus

Homework

- A Brainbuilder and mental maths homework alternates with electronic reading and an online maths game.
- Each homework lasts 2 weeks

Homework

- The brainbuilder activity is usually related to the current topic and is normally completed in the brainbuilder book.
- Mental maths questions are given out in a Mental Maths Folder. Answers to these should not be written! (jottings permitted) Sometimes feedback may be useful.

Homework

- Electronic homework consists of an online maths game using the Abacus 'activelearnprimary' website and electronic reading using 'bugclub'.
- Children continue to use logins previously allocated.

Spellings

- 10 class spellings and 5 challenge spellings a week
- Class spellings are usually tested on a Monday and new spellings given out after the test for testing one week later
- Challenge spellings are usually tested on Wednesday and new spellings given out after the test for testing one week later

Spellings

To learn spellings

- Use look, say, cover, write, check.
- Look at the shape of the word
- Write in the air/carpet with an imaginary pencil
- Write without looking
- Sound out/spell out loud

Tables

- All children start on X2 tables.
- Tables tests are usually every Tuesday.
- The order of learning is x2, x5, x10, x3, x4, x6, x7, x8, x9, x11, x12
- When children are error free in their tables test they move on to the next table.

Spellings and Tables

- Children practise in a combined Spellings and tables folder
- one spelling and one tables column should be completed each day both at home and at school.
