Progression in Year I/P2

The following chart gives an overview of the 'Revisit' and 'New Learning' objectives that are covered across Year I/P2, as well as the frequency with which they are taught. There is some consolidation of Reception/PI content in the early missions and any objectives that are introduced towards the end of the year are covered again in Year 2/P3.

It is assumed that at the start of Mission I in Year I/P2, most children will be able to:

- use talk to share ideas and opinions
- use talk to recount experience
- ▶ use connectives to link ideas in talk: and, because
- use talk to experiment with rhyming words
- draw lines and circles using gross motor movements
- use one-handed tools and equipment to make marks or shapes
- hold and use a pencil correctly
- show control in mark making
- write groups of letters to represent meaning.
