

Coronavirus Update

Here are some reminders of school procedures during this pandemic and what we have found has gone well over the past few days. Our stance is still a cautious one where we aim to keep everyone safe.

Children are washing their hands several times during the day; all staff are cleaning the equipment and tables after use; children are taught to adopt good respiratory hygiene and we are taking the children's temperatures before they come into the classroom.

All children will remain in their classroom group for all lessons, play time, lunch and coming in and out of school. The classrooms have been rearranged and each child has their own table (except in the EYFS) and all the tables are facing forward. Children have been taught about their own personal bubble and that no one should be entering their own personal space.

At present we are not having any whole school events such as assemblies. Obviously, we are a very small school and when it comes to Breakfast Club and After School Club the children will be segregated wherever possible. There are many children across the school who have siblings, so it is almost impossible to completely segregate every child.

Additional adults and clubs

We have no immediate plans to provide any additional clubs at the moment. If we do run clubs, they will be class based and run by TA staff or teachers. At present, Mrs Walker is taking piano and the Windsor Sports Partnership are covering some PE lessons. Both have Covid-friendly procedures.

Drop offs and Pick ups

Everyone is doing so well with the new timings of the beginning and end of our school day. You will notice that your child's new teacher will start to pick your child up as we begin our shunt up timetable. The children have done so well last week we are accelerating this timetable.

Please note that your teacher will be ready ten minutes before, and five minutes after, the collection to avoid parents waiting together on the road.

Government Guidelines

We are adhering to all National guidelines. If a child has a temperature above 38 degrees or they appear unwell with a cough, then they will be sent home immediately. Staff will need to wear full PPE and wait with your child until they are collected. If your child or a member of your

family are unwell then we would ask you to immediately self-isolate, take a test and inform the school. The same procedure will happen if a staff member is unwell. If the test is negative, but the symptoms are still present, then we would not like anyone to return back to school, even staff members. We expect everyone to have an active engagement with the Track and NHS Trace procedures. If there is a positive case, then we will follow the NHS Track and Trace advice. All parents will be informed.

If you plan to go on holiday and then have to self-isolate, then we would ask that you respect government procedures and stay at home for 14 days.

Lunchtimes

Caterlink have a comprehensive risk assessment and all food is prepared with Sonia wearing full PPE. As you are aware, we are just providing grab bags, but the next step will be to provide our firm favourites such as jacket potatoes, fish and chips, pizza etc.

This will start with fish and chips on Thursday 3rd October.

PE kits

We will be asking for PE bags to be brought into school in the near future. At present we are asking parents to send their child into school in their full PE kit including T-shirt, shorts, trainers, track suit joggers and sweatshirt every **FRIDAY** starting from this Friday if possible. There is a slight risk of children getting changed in school and at present we are not using our cloakrooms.

Rucksacks & NO Bookbags

Children have been asked to bring in a lot of things into school e.g. lunchboxes, snacks, water bottles, coat etc. To help to carry all these things we are finding that the most useful thing is to put everything into a rucksack which can be placed under the child's table in their personal space. This only applies to Year 1, 2, 3, and 4.

Please remember that your child only needs a small lunch and an even smaller snack and if they have a school packed lunch, they will need a water bottle so they can have a drink throughout the day.

Please do not bring in book bags.

Communication

We will continue to keep the portal open between teachers and parents to help you with any enquiries you have with homework and up and coming events. Please send your messages during school hours, not evenings or weekends. Teachers will always send their messages out on Sunday evening.

Mrs Calvert and the office will aim to send out a message on Mondays.

Car Parking

It is more important than ever to adhere to our Traffic Code of Conduct. We are dismissing siblings together so that parents do not have to wait on the kerb side. Some parents have commented that they are having to walk on the road because of congregation of parents. I appreciate that there is a social aspect to bringing your child to school but if you could pick up or drop off and leave immediately, we would be very grateful.

Homework

Teachers will continue to provide weekly homework in due course. It will be wholly based upon what they have been learning in the classroom so that we can continue your excellent support.

To reduce resources moving from home to school and visa versa reading books, spellings, worksheets will all be electronic.

News from the PTA

There is going to be a collection of Happy Bags on Wednesday 23rd September. The drop off point will be just over the small wall in front of the main car park. There will be a sign to indicate where to put the bags. There will be a staggered timetable to drop your bags for the parents who want to avoid the crowds.

The PTA AGM has been postponed until further notice.

During the next few weeks we are having a class PE tournament which will involve an endurance run, races and athletics. Each child will receive a medal on this day thanks to our PTA.
