

- Help children to develop the resilience to tackle all of life's challenges through teaching Character Education and a positive mindset.

#### Our standards this year

The children have performed exceptionally well again this year. 96% of our Year 1 pupils passed their phonics test and we reported to the DFE between 86% and 89% of children in Year 2 achieved expected or above expected standards. Similarly, in Year 4, approximately 90% of children, achieved appropriate or above levels for their age. National averages were between 65% and 74% for KS1 assessments. This is due to a tremendous effect on behalf of all the teachers. This is a real achievement, as the curriculum has got eight months harder.

#### How are we working with parents?

The school values the contribution of parents through our PTA. This year we have achieved a huge amount alongside a fantastic team of parents.
