Through our Pupil Parliament sessions, we have looked at the impact of having time off school on our pupils. They all completed a survey regarding their perspective on Lockdown; the new hot menu and names for our new dining area.

When asked what the best aspects of Lockdown, they said they liked spending time with their family, having a more relaxed day and having their parents as their teacher. Nearly all agreed that the hardest thing was missing their friends and having to do work without their teachers.


They also said that their parents made them work harder than school.

## Coronavirus Update

Here are some reminders of school procedures during this pandemic.

Children are still washing their hands several times during the day; all staff are cleaning the equipment and tables after use; children are taught to adopt good respiratory hygiene and we are taking the children's temperatures before they come into the classroom.

All children will remain in their classroom group for all lessons, play time, lunch and coming in and out of school. The classrooms continue to be organised to reduce face-to-face contact when learning. Children obviously find it hard to stay socially distanced, but they are aware of their personal bubble and that no one should be entering their own personal space.

At present we are not having any whole school events and since we went into Tier 2, we have greatly restricted the visitors into school. Anyone who is in school follows our Covid-friendly procedures

Whilst we have no immediate plans to provide any additional clubs, the booster and childcare clubs offer some support to our working families. Next term the teachers will be conducting their usual 'catch-up' classes for the Spring term.

## Drop offs and Pick ups

Thank you to everyone who has supported our new drop off and pick up procedures.

The slight change we will be making next term is that all classes will be dismissed on time at the end of the school day

**Year 1 and Foundation at 3pm and Year 2,3 and 4 at 3.15 pm** but the teacher will be waiting for 10 minutes after this time to ensure that parents can avoid periods of congestion.

To avoid parents having to wait on a busy road which is unsafe and adding to the problems on the road, **all siblings will be dismissed with their older sister or brother at their dismissal times.**

These arrangements are

Year 4 at the main gate for 3.15pm  
Year 3 at the annexe for 3.15pm  
Year 2 at the annexe for 3.15pm  
Year 1 at the annexe for 3pm and  
EYFS at the main gate for 3pm.

All the younger siblings will stay in their own classroom with their teacher until they are dismissed alongside their family member.

All drop offs at 8am or 8.45am remains the same arrangements. Please be prompt.

## Government Guidelines for Covid 19

We are adhering to all National guidelines. If a child has a temperature above 38 degrees or they appear unwell with a cough, then they will be sent home immediately.

If your child or a member of your family are unwell then we would ask you to immediately self-isolate for 10 to 14 days, take a test and inform the school of the outcomes. We expect everyone to have an active engagement with the NHS Track and Trace procedures.

If there is a positive case at school, then we will follow the HSE advice and all parents will be informed. The risk assessment of the school is the responsibility of myself and as such I apply the guidelines in the way I feel best suits the staff, children and parents of our school.

If you plan to go on holiday and then have to self-isolate for 10 days, (or 5 if you pay for a test). We would ask that you respect government procedures.

**We do need everyone to support these guidelines to keep us all safe at Braywood.**

**We have had our fair share of positive cases and this will only be more apparent when we return back to school in January.**

### PE Fridays

We will still be asking for children to come to school in their PE kits on Fridays. There is an extensive physical programme on this day. PE is undertaken on other days e.g. every child has a PE burst but these have been organised so that a PE kit is not required. This greatly reduces and risk to staff members.

### Rucksacks & NO Bookbags

Recently, there have been some organisational changes that have gone really well and may be maintained after this pandemic e.g. playground arrangements, rucksacks, eating together as a class etc. are preferred by some children.

### Communication

Communication will continue as normal. We have started to use the school WhatsApp for urgent messages, and we will be hosting our Parent/Child and Teacher consultations in March. Please continue to send your messages during school hours, not evenings or weekends. Teachers will always send their messages out on Sunday evening.

We have been holding some virtual lessons for the children who have had to self-isolate whilst the rest of the class are in school.

### Car Parking

**It is more important than ever to adhere to our Traffic Code of Conduct.** At present there are daily complaints regarding parents parking on the double yellow lines and who do not change this behaviour regardless of repeated pleas. In the new year we will be asking the community traffic wardens to police this matter as a last resort.

We also require parents not to congregate on or near the school and leave as soon as you have collected your child/ren. This adds to traffic congestion and obstructs the ability for our parents to social distance.

I appreciate that there is a social aspect to bringing your child to school, but I think at the present time this would need to be arranged virtually or at another venue.

### Homework


Teachers will continue to provide weekly homework but with reduced movement of paper/books between home and school. This will be reviewed in the new year.
