### **Trips this Term**

Year 1 are visiting Milestones as time travellers as this museum goes back in time through different eras.

Year 2 are visiting the Reading Museum to have a workshop on Victorian Toys. This is related to their topic and will be their 'Wow' day.

Year 3 are discovering more about the workplace. This is a very independent type of trip where children are free to explore different vocations in a safe environment.

Year 4 are attending a Tag Rugby festival with many other schools in Windsor.

### **Curriculum Meetings**

There will be an opportunity to find out more about the KS1 SATs in Year 2 and the Phonics Test in Year 1 in the curriculum meeting on World Book Day at 3pm. A crèche will be provided.

#### Social Media

We are fortunate to be able to communicate with each other in lots of different ways.

As a school we use our eschools platform for many purposes, but probably the most important of these is our payment and communication systems. Eschool's messages from all teachers will be posted on Sundays and the office will always post letters on Fridays so you should only need to check your platform on Mondays.

To support this process the office have a weekly email that will be sent to your personal email and placed on your platform together with this newsletter which covers items in more depth.

If you want to speak to your child's teacher they are outside at the beginning and the end of the day. Messages can be sent to the office and they will be forwarded to the class teacher who will respond as soon as possible.

You may be aware that we tweet every day and you are most welcome to follow us.

As regards to other means of communication each class has a WhatsApp platform and the PTA have a Facebook page. Both areas are for positive forms of communication and fall under our Social Media policy (See attached)

#### **Easter Concert**

The Easter Concert is again on the last day of term at 1.30pm. The performance should finish at 2pm when the school closes for the Easter break.

Please be advised that Bray Cricket Club will be available and that it is very important to park courteously and if possible car share.

There will be a slight change to the organisation of this event. Parents will be asked to drop their child off at church at 8.45-9am on the morning of the Easter Concert at church.

This will save the school a lot of money on coach costs and will allow us to rehearse on site.

Your child will need a packed lunch on that day. A school packed lunch specifically for this event must be ordered by the 1<sup>st</sup> March from the office.

# Changes to our Behaviour Policy

We do have very good behaviour across our school, only last week two separate visitors commented upon how polite and helpful they found our children.

To build upon this success we have made some slight changes that your child may come home and talk about. This is to reflect two areas:

1. <u>Clarity</u> - we are going to have just three rules across the school.

'Ready, Respectful and Safe'.

2. Celebrate more pupils' good behaviour - good choices will be celebrated more overtly by placing that child on the green traffic light system or cloud instead of everyone automatically starting on the green every day.

Our Monday Celebration Assembly is where children are congratulated in front of the whole school. Each teacher chooses one or two children who have excelled last week and they will have lunch with Mrs Calvert in the staff room. A child

is also chosen to have the Kindness Award and is allowed to hold the candle during our prayers. The class who have eaten their lunch politely and quietly for our lunchtime controllers receives 5 minutes additional playtime.

Additional awards are for excellent performance in reading, writing or Y4 times tables where the child receives a book or a pencil. Spelling or maths competencies which are correct three times in a row receive a gold sticker and good presentation gets a handwriting certificate or a pen.
